Entries can be lodged until 5 :00 pm, Monday 14 February 2022. To make other arrangements, please call the Showground office on 49335052
- Entry fee:** \$1.00 each entry up to \$20.00 (remainder are free)
- Staging:** Entries must be dropped off at the McDonald Pavilion on Thursday 17 February 2022 between 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm or between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm. Cars can enter to unload via the Evans Street gate.
- Judging:** 10:00 am, Friday 18 February 2022
- Removal:** Produce can only be removed from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm Sunday 20 February 2022. Vehicles cannot enter the Showground before 4:00 pm. Entries not collected will be donated to the Slow Food Rescue Kitchen project.

- A1 Kent/JAP pumpkin (*Cucurbita moschata*)
- A2 Butternut pumpkin (*C. moschata*)
- A3 Gramma pumpkin/squash (*C. moschata*)
- A4 Tromboncino or climbing crookneck pumpkin/squash (*C. moschata*)
- A5 Queensland blue pumpkin (*C. maxima*)
- A6 Ironbark pumpkin (*C. maxima*)
- A7 Golden nugget pumpkin (*C. maxima*)—minimum of 3
- A8 Turk's turban pumpkin (*C. maxima*)
- A9 Any other variety of pumpkin, marrow, or *winter* squash of any *Cucurbita* species
- A10 Zucchini (*Cucurbita pepo*)—minimum 3 of same variety
- A11 Any other variety of summer squash or marrow (*Cucurbita pepo*)
- A12 Cucumber—Crystal Apple—minimum 3
- A13 Cucumber—Richmond Green—minimum 3
- A14 Cucumber—Lebanese—minimum 3
- A15 Cucumber—any other type—minimum 3 of same variety
- A16 Red tiger, tiger baby and other tiger striped watermelon
- A17 Moon & stars watermelon
- A18 Warpaint or crimson sweet watermelon
- A19 Watermelon—any other variety
- A20 Rockmelon—2 of the same variety
- A21 Honey dew melon—2 of the same variety
- A22 Truss of minimum 3 tomatoes
- A23 Cherry tomato—minimum 10 of same variety
- A24 Heirloom tomatoes of same variety—minimum 3
- A25 Eggplant—minimum 3 of same variety

- A26 Capsicum—minimum 3 of same variety
- A27 Chilli—minimum 10 of same variety
- A28 Sweetcorn—minimum 3 cobs of same variety
- A29 Multicoloured corn—minimum 3 cobs
- A30 Long (snake) bean—minimum 10 tied in a bunch
- A31 Green bean—minimum 10
- A32 Any other variety of bean—minimum 10 of same variety
- A33 Garlic—plait
- A34 Garlic—5 bulbs of same variety
- A35 Garlic—3 bulbs of 3 different varieties
- A36 Brown onion—6 bulbs
- A37 Red onion—6 bulbs
- A38 Eschalot—6 bulbs
- A39 Green onion, spring onion or green shallot—bunch of 6
- A40 Any other variety of onion—6 of same variety
- A41 Any varieties of onion—3 of 3 different varieties
- A42 Leek—bunch of 3
- A43 Asian greens—bunch of same variety
- A44 Any other Asian vegetable
- A45 Silver beet or ruby/rainbow chard —bunch of minimum 5 stalks
- A46 Carrot—bunch of 6 of same variety
- A47 White Sebago potato 3
- A48 Pink eye potato 3
- A49 Potato—any other variety—3 of same variety
- A50 Sweet potato—3 of same variety
- A51 Native Australian fruit, minimum 3 to 5
- A52 Australian macadamia nuts—minimum 6

- A53 Native Australian herb—bunch
- A54 Native Australian vegetable
- A55 Any other root or tuber vegetable not mentioned above
- A56 Any other leafy green vegetable not mentioned above
- A57 Citrus fruit—minimum 3 of same variety
- A58 Any other fruit—minimum 3 of same variety
- A59 Nuts—minimum 6 of same variety
- A60 Bunch of herbs—minimum 6 varieties with stems in water—maximum 1 entry per person
- A61 Basket of mixed salad vegetables

- A62 Egg—12 white eggs in carton
- A63 Egg—12 brown eggs in carton
- A64 Egg—12 mixed eggs in carton
- A65 Egg—basket of 12 bantam eggs

- A67 Egg—basket of at least 12 mixed quail eggs
