between 7:30am and 8:30 am.

JUDGING: 10:00am, Friday 16th February 2024

ABBREVIATIONS: D = distinct means different e.g., separate varieties/cultivars.

NND = not necessarily distinct means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of different/cultivars, they can all be identical or different or they can be more than

one colour.

OTHER: All vases will be supplied by the Association unless stipulated otherwise.

FLORAL ART SUBSECTION

STAGING: Entries for flower art must be dropped off at the George McDonald Pavilion on

Thursday 15th February 2024 between 5:30pm and 8:30pm. Arrangements can be

completed on Friday 16th February between 7:30am and 9:00am.

JUDGING: 9:30am, Friday 16th February 2024

GRADES: A – People who have won a Champion at a flower show, or are instructors, judges or

engaged professionally in floral art.

B – People who have NOT won a Champion at a flower show.

C – People who have NOT won more than four 1st prizes at a flower show.

OTHER: All care but no responsibility will be taken for embellishments in the Floral Art

Subsection. Any embellishments except artificial flowers are allowed.

POT PLANT SUBSECTION

STAGING: Entries must be dropped off at the George McDonald Pavilion on Thursday 15th

February 2024 between 5:30pm and 8:30pm.

JUDGING: 9:30am, Friday 16th February 2024

OTHER: Pot plants must be grown in pots, baskets or mounted.
