NND = not necessarily distinct means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of different/cultivars, they can all be identical or different or they can be

more than one colour.

OTHER: All vases will be supplied by the Association unless stipulated otherwise.

FLORAL ART SUBSECTION

GRADES: A – People who have won a Champion at a flower show, or are instructors,

judges or engaged professionally in floral art.

B – People who have NOT won a Champion at a flower show.

C – People who have NOT won more than four 1st prizes at a flower show.

OTHER: All care but no responsibility will be taken for embellishments in the Floral

Art Subsection. Any embellishments except artificial flowers are allowed.

POT PLANT SUBSECTION

OTHER: Pot plants must be grown in pots, baskets or mounted.
