Conditions of Entry for Exhibitors

- 1. Please Note that great care will be taken with all work entered; no responsibility shall be accepted by the Association or Committee for loss or damage to an entry.
- 2. The Pavilions housing the competitive exhibitors will be closed to the public during judging.
- 3. The Judges' decisions in all sections are final.
- 4. No correspondence will be entered into. Prizes in the open sections may not be awarded where the entry is not up to standard. Judges will be considering: Skill, Finish, Difficulty, Design, Utility, Wow Factor and Material. (Most to least importance) and may exercise discretion to re-classify the category of entry.
- 5. No more than three entries in each class per exhibitor. Each entry can only be entered in one class.
- 6. All exhibits to be made within the last 18 months and not to have been exhibited at a previous Maitland Show, and to be primarily work of the entrant.
- 7. Junior and Youth entrants are a. Junior and Youth entrants are allowed to use adult assistance for hazardous activities.
- 8. Judges and MWG committee may issue additional special prizes on judging day (e.g. tied first prize, class project, or exceptional work when compared to entrant's peers and/or not strictly meeting category requirements) or re-allocate entries to more appropriate sections

8501	WW1 - Any turned wooden item turned on a faceplate or chuck.	
8502	WW2 - Any wooden platter or bowl (not necessarily turned)	
8503	WW3 - Any wooden item turned between centres/spindle.	
8504	WW4 - Any wooden box not turned.	
8505	WW5 - Any wooden toy or puzzle.	
8506	WW6 - Any miniature items, a set of two or more.(e.g. dolls house furniture, figures, animals)	
8507	WW7 - Pens hand turned (max of 2 pens per entry). Pens will be displayed on common stands	
8508	WW8 - Any wooden item-not turned. e.g., scroll saw, marquetry, intarsia, carved item engraving,	
pyrography etc.
