NND = not necessarily distinct means an exhibit need not necessarily consist of different/cultivars, they can all be identical or different or they can be more than one colour.

OTHER: All vases will be supplied by the Association unless stipulated otherwise.

FLORAL ART SUBSECTION

GRADES: A – People who have won a Champion at a flower show including Maitland Show, or are instructors, judges or engaged professionally in floral art.

B – People who have NOT won a Champion at a flower show.

C – People who have NOT won more than four 1st prizes at a flower show.

OTHER: All care but no responsibility will be taken for embellishments in the Floral Art Subsection. Any embellishments except artificial flowers are allowed.

Roses

Explanatory (Extract) Notes from “The Royal Horticultural Society of New South Wales Inc. Judging Standards and Guidelines (2022)”, (with reference to material from

THE NATIONAL ROSE SOCIETY OF AUSTRALIA and THE ROSE SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES (used with permission).

1. ‘The expression “Exhibition Rose”, shall include Hybrid Tea, and Climbing Hybrid Tea type rose which, with or without disbudding can produce one large flower to a stem.’
2. ‘The expression ‘Bunch of Roses”, types as above (1), side buds and side flowers not permitted.’
3. ‘The expression “Cluster-Flowered Roses” shall include those previously described as floribunda, floribunda hybrid tea style, floribunda shrub, cluster flowered climber and rambler, hybrid polyantha and polyantha pom-pom.’
4. EXHIBITION TYPE FLOWERS (LARGE FLOWERED): The highest type of exhibition type flower is one which has good form, freshness, size, substance, brilliance, refinement and purity of colour, and which, at time of judging, at the stage of maximum possible beauty.’ Exhibition Type flowers are to be shown singly.
5. ‘DECORATIVE ROSES (LARGE FLOWERED: A decorative rose is one having well-formed petals of good substance, naturally and gracefully arranged to produce a refined shape of more slender proportions than an exhibition bloom. Side buds are allowed.
6. ‘CLUSTER FLOWERED ROSES: The most desirable cluster-flowered stem is one having the optimum number of fresh open or partly open flowers characteristic of the variety, gracefully arranged on the main stem. Faded flowers may be removed but untidy removal will be penalised.
7. ‘MINIATURE ROSES: Miniature roses shall have small flowers together with proportionately small foliage. The stems must be thin and wiry. Flowers may be single or double, borne singly or in well-balanced terminal clusters.

Dahlia

Explanatory (Extract) Notes from “The Royal Horticultural Society of New South Wales Inc. Judging Standards and Guidelines (2022)”, by courtesy of DAHLIA SOCIETY OF NEW & ACT INC. and THE AUSTRALIAN DAHLIA COUNCIL. (used with permission)

1. DECORATIVE DAHLIA - Formal / Informal / Semi Decorative.

Bloom should be fully double. The centre should be closed and should be as high as the surrounding florets. Florets should radiate evenly from the centre without gaps. Depth of the bloom should be at least two thirds, but not more than its diameter.

2. CACTUS DAHLIA

Bloom should be fully double. Centre should be cone-shaped and at least as high as the face florets. Florets should radiate evenly from the centre without uneven gaps between the rows. Florets may be incurved or straight. Depth should be at least two thirds, but not more than its diameter. There should be sufficient florets to prevent gaps in formation and outline.

All exhibits must be judged as seen at the time of judging and not as they possibly were or might become. The stem should be straight, situated centrally to the bloom, rigid and round. Blooms should generally face upwards.

Blooms should be staged, without artificial support, at least 160 mm clear of the staging container.
